

Good Friday Tenebrae Vespers

Good Friday *Tenebrae* worship continues the *Triduum Sacrum*, without Invocation or Benediction. The Office of Tenebrae is an ancient order of worship conducted during the final days of the observance of Our LORD's Passion in commemoration of the suffering and death of Our LORD JESUS CHRIST for the sin of the world.

The word "Tenebraw" means darkness or shadows, and the Office of Tenebrae was traditionally prayed during the monastic offices of Matins and Lauds, on all three days of the Triduum. In recent times the service has been observed only on the evening of Good Friday. Traditionally, seven altar candles were extinguished at Tenebrae, though the number of candles varied greatly from place to place.

Participants wear choir vestments while the clergy wear neither cope nor stole nor tippet (preaching stole). No reverence is made toward the altar.

In preparation for Tenebrae, please meditate quietly and prayerfully on the glorious Gospel of Our LORD JESUS CHRIST in all that He has done for you.

The bells heard distinctively seven times, one time for each of the sentences Christ spoke from the cross.

THE DRIVING OF THE NAILS

The sound of nails driven into wood is heard. Three nails are used reminding us of Christ's hands and feet which were nailed to the cross.

PSALMODY

Psalm 2 Antiphon: Psalm 2: 11, 12b

- P Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling. Blessèd are all who take refuge in Him.
- Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain?
- The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against his anointed, saying,
- P "Let us burst their bonds apart and cast away their cords from us."
- He who sits in the heavens laughs;the Lord holds them in derision.P Then He will speak to them in His wrath,

PSALM 22 Antiphon: Psalm 22

- P But you, O LORD, do not be far off! O you my help, come quickly to my aid! My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning?
- O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest.
- **P** Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- **■** In you our fathers trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- **P** To you they cried and were rescued; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.
- **©** But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people.
- P All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads;
- **©** "He trusts in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"
- P Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breasts.
- © On you was I cast from my birth, and from my mother's womb you have been my God.
- **P** Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.
- **■** Many bulls encompass me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me;
- **P** They open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.
- **■** I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint;
- **P** my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;
- my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
- **P** For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet −

- **C** I can count all my bones they stare and gloat over me;
- **P** They divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots.
- But you, O LORD, do not be far off! O you my help, come quickly to my aid!
- P Deliver my soul from the sword, my precious life from the power of the dog! Save me from the mouth of the lion! You have rescued me from the horns of the wild oxen!
- **©** I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:
- P You who fear the LORD, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him, and stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!
- C For he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted
- **P** and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him.
- **©** From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear him.
- P The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the LORD! May you heart live forever!
- All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD,
- **P** and all the families of the nations shall worship before You.
- © For kingship belongs to the LORD, and he rules over the nations.
- P All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive.
- **©** Posterity shall serve him; it shall be told of the Lord to the coming generation;
- **P** they shall come and proclaim his righteousness to a people yet unborn, that he has done it. But you, O LORD, do not be far off! O you my help, come quickly to my aid!

PSALM 27 Antiphon: Psalm 27:1

- P The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?
- The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?
- P When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh,
- **C** My adversaries and foes, it is they who stumble and fall.
- P Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear;
- C Though war arise against me, yet I will be confident.
- P One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after:
- That I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life,
- P To gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in His temple.
- C For He will hide me in His shelter in the day of trouble;
- P He will conceal me under the cover of His tent; He will lift me high upon a rock.

- **©** Give me not up to the will of my adversaries; for false witnesses have risen against me, and they breathe out violence.
- P I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living!
- Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!
- P The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?

- © Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness.
- P O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.
- **©** For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering.
- P The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- **©** Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; build up the walls of Jerusalem;
- P Then will you delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on Your altar.

The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ

HYMN "Oh Sacred Head, Now Wounded" (LSB, #450 Stanzas 1-3)

(Please **stand**.)

JOHN 19: 1-16a

1Then Pilate took Jesus and flogged him. 2And the soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on his head and arrayed him in a purple robe. 3They came up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and struck him with their hands. 4Pilate went out again and said to them, "See, I am bringing him out to you that you may know that I find no guilt in him." 5So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Behold the man!" 6When the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no guilt in him." 7The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has made himself the Son of God." 8When Pilate heard this statement, he was even more afraid. 9He entered his headquarters again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. 10So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you and authority to crucify you?" 11Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over me at all unless it had been given you from above. Therefore he who delivered me over to you has the greater sin." 12From then on Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend. Everyone who makes himself a king opposes Caesar." 13So when Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called The Stone Pavement, and in Aramaic Gabbatha. 14Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover. It was about the sixth hour. He said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" 15They cried out, "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." 16So he delivered him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus,

P The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. John, the 19th chapter.

JOHN 19: 16b-42

16So he delivered him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, 17and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. 18There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them. 19Pilate also wrote an inscription and put it on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." 20Many of the Jews read this inscription, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and it was written in Aramaic, in Latin, and in Greek. 21So the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but rather, 'This man said, I am King of the Jews.'" 22Pilate answered, "What I have written I have written." 23When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his garments and divided them into four parts, one part for each soldier; also his tunic. But the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom, 24so they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it shall be." This was to fulfill the Scripture which says, "They divided my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots." So the soldiers did these things, 25but standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. 26When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" 27Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. 28After this, Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), "I thirst." 29A jar full of sour wine stood there, so they put a sponge full of the sour wine on a hyssop branch and held it to his mouth. 30When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, "It is finished," and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

31Since it was the day of Preparation, and so that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken and that they might be taken away. 32So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first, and of the other who had been crucified with him. 33But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. 34But one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. 35He who saw it has borne witness—his testimony is true, and he knows that he is telling the truth—that you also may believe. 36For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken." 37And again another Scripture says, "They will look on him whom they have pierced." 38After these things Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body. 39Nicodemus also, who earlier had come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds in weight. 40So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. 41Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. 42So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, since the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.
